- 1. AgriRecovery announcement: On August 10 the provincial government announced \$119 million in support through the AgriRecovery program to help cattle producers that have been hit hard by the drought. APAS NPF submission to AAFC: We recently sent a submission to Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) that includes principles and objectives that APAS would like the government to focus on during their Next Policy Framework (NPF) consultations. APAS has also created a new NPF Task Force with Bill Prybylski (APAS Vice President) as the Chair, so we're currently finalizing the remaining Task Force members.
